
9 MILE BEACH SIGHTINGS IN NOVEMBER 2022

SHOREBIRD SHOWS TRUE GRIT.

Spotted and photographed by Ranger Greg on 9-Mile Beach in the last fortnight (first seen on Sunday 20nov22). This could be a lucky (or unlucky, depending on the story) Silver Gull¹ (*Larus novaehollandiae*). Maybe it shows remarkable resilience in surviving an encounter with an offshore oil slick. Or maybe it's a Sooty Oystercatcher (*Haemotopus fuliginosis*) visiting from Broughton Island at this time of year (as records² show). A good look at the body posture, feet and shape of beak will rule out the oystercatcher, and other guesses.



Hunter Bird Observer Club expert and founding member, Alan Stuart, identified it for us as a melanistic Silver Gull, something of a rarity around the world (as a Google search reveals). Melanism is generally defined as an increase of dark pigment in the plumage, resulting in a blackish appearance³ So it's not a new or different species of gull, just unusual.





OTHER SHOREBIRD SIGHTINGS ON 9-MILE BEACH IN NOVEMBER INCLUDE:

- 6 Greater Crested Terns (*Thalasseus bergii*) roosting with Silver Gulls on the shoreline near Third Creek (22nov22). This is a common resident bird species.
- 1 Red-capped Plover (*Charadrius ruficapillus*) brooding one egg on a sand nest at the North Dune (reported by Ranger Clinton on same date, and two adult birds seen on the hind dune by Ranger Kevin in the same week).

These sightings are shared to encourage visitors and locals to enjoy bird-watching that is conservation-minded (ethical and protective of our vulnerable species) in this area.
